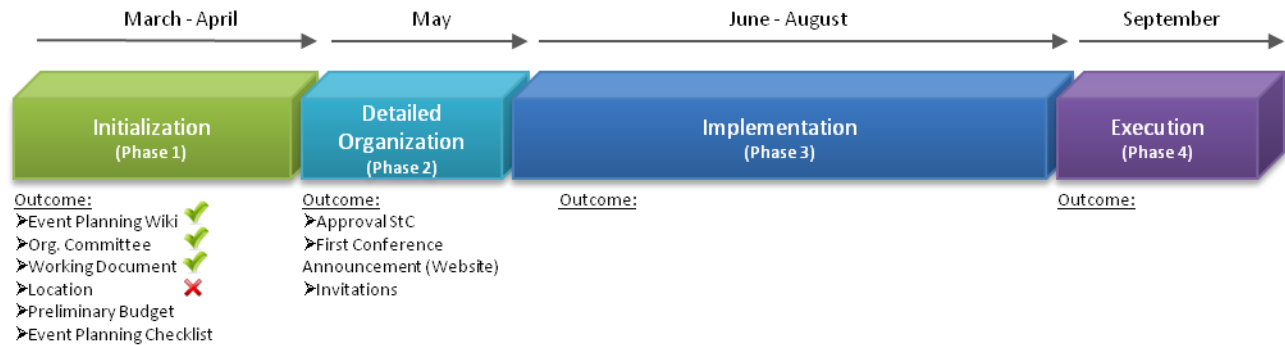

1. Introduction to the OSLC Connect 2013 [Pending]

WG Internal Background Discussion: OSLC gets more and more attention and it is becoming popular in its problem domain as emerging standard for tool integration and interoperability. For example, providers (tool and technology developers) get requests from customers to develop OSLC integrations, leading European research projects in the domain of safety critical systems and software engineering are looking at OSLC and the proposed interoperability technologies as part of their common strategy for future tool interoperability.
